4	<p>Police report – period 26/04/2017 – 23/05/2017</p> <p>Road safety</p> <p>There were several calls over the month regarding speeding motor cycles and motor vehicles in and around the Aberlady and Drem areas. No registration numbers passed at the time.</p> <p>Antisocial behaviour</p> <p>During the evening of 25/05/17, Police were informed of damage to the bowling club hut at Dirleton. Details taken and enquiries are still ongoing. During the early hours of 19/6/17, there was a report of youths shouting in and around Muirfield Station, Gullane. Unfortunately, no Police resources were available to attend. There was a report of racing vehicles on 6/6/17 near to Yellowcraig, Dirleton but no Police resources were free to attend.</p> <p>Housebreaking</p> <p>There have been no reports of housebreaking in the area over the past month.</p> <p>Parking</p> <p>There have been no parking issues reported over the past month.</p> <p>Other</p> <p>On 09/06/17, there was a report of a theft of an electric drill from a building site near Hall Crescent, Gullane. Details taken for further enquiry. On 11/6/17, there was a report that the barrier at Yellowcraig had been cut and travellers had set up camp. This was passed to East Lothian Council.</p> <p>The next CAPP meeting would be held on Wednesday 30/8/17 (no July meeting).</p> <p>In the discussion which followed, concern was expressed about speeding and noisy motorcyclists, particularly in the Gullane area. PCP agreed that the police</p>	

	<p>would seek to monitor this. He suggested that this should be adopted as a CAPP priority and this was agreed.</p> <p>An email had been received from an Aberlady resident, complaining about dangerous driving in the Aberlady area, particularly along the Gosford estate frontage. This was noted by PCP and PCG but it was agreed that it was an issue difficult to control.</p>	
5	<p>Local priorities</p> <p>An email had been received from Mark Lucas, a trustee of Gullane Sports Development Trust, which is seeking funding for a sports pavilion in Gullane, following the successful development of the astro-turf sports pitch in 2013, to which the Local Priorities Fund had made a contribution, and its extensive use since then. There was at present a shortfall of about £13,000. He had asked whether the Fund might contribute to the fitting out of shower and toilet facilities in the changing rooms (circa £3,000 required) or the kitchen fit-out (circa £1,500 required). There was general support for this request. AMcC, DH and TD would consider this further with a view to asking Mr Lucas to submit a formal application in time for a decision to be made at the July Community Council meeting. It was also suggested that an application for funding should be made to the John Imrie Fund. DA would advise further on this in liaison with Mr Lucas. DH noted that the Area Partnership may also be able to assist.</p> <p>SM advised that an application was likely to be made shortly to assist with the purchase of a defibrillator for Drem.</p>	<p>DH AMcC TD</p> <p>DA</p>
6	<p>Planning matters</p> <p>Gullane housing sites</p> <p>There was general discussion about ongoing concern over the grant of planning permission for the Saltcoats Field and Fenton Gait East developments in Gullane and over voting issues within ELC's planning committee. CllH noted that although she is not on the planning committee she would seek to ensure that constituents' concerns were properly represented.</p> <p>Planning application – Craigour, Broadgait, Gullane</p> <p>It was noted that a recent application for the erection of a house in Broadgait, Gullane, seemed likely to involve the felling of trees subject to a Tree Preservation Order. MW had considered this and took the view that this would not adversely affect the amenity of the area. It was therefore agreed that the Community Council would not intervene in the application.</p> <p>Dirleton</p> <p>Castlemains, Dirleton</p> <p>TT advised that CALA have withdrawn their interest in this development and that Queensberry Properties, a partnership between Cruden Homes (East) Limited and Buccleuch Property, have entered into a contract with the landowner to proceed with similar to that which had been proposed by CALA. They expect to hold a public consultation in late August or early September and to submit a planning application shortly afterwards. It is likely that they will make a presentation to the Dirleton Village Association in mid-August and it was agreed that if they did so it would not be necessary for them to make an additional presentation to the</p>

8	<p>Village Reports</p> <p>Aberlady The War Memorial is in need of refurbishment. There has been consultation with two architects who have had dealings with previous proposals for the memorial's upgrade and who have offered to assist in producing a new scheme for its refurbishment. This is still in progress due to both being on holiday, however we hope to produce a planned project in the near future.</p> <p>The village notice board had been damaged and replacement is being considered. This would require planning permission and the landowner's consent.</p> <p>Dirleton Nothing outstanding</p> <p>Drem Nothing outstanding, but see under Area Partnership, below.</p> <p>Gullane JH reported that Falko, the specialist baker, would be closing their Gullane shop as a result of their move to Haddington. The timing of this was unknown.</p> <p>Concern was expressed about lack of progress by CALA on their housing development on the Fire Service college site. DA had spoken with Colin Thain, their site manager, who had stated, as previously, that this was because of problems with statutory undertakers over the termination of redundant services to the site. It was agreed to monitor the position.</p> <p>Concern was expressed, as previously, about the lack of an outdoor ATM consequent on the pending closure of Bank of Scotland's Gullane branch and the failure of the Co-op to engage with the suggestion that they move their indoor ATM outside. CllrF had been progressing enquiries about this and the matter would be pursued with him.</p> <p>West Fenton With the Saltcoats development now approved, MW expressed concern about the future use of the roads through West Fenton. He will seek support and assistance at a future Community Council meeting. This will relate to the next stage of CALA's application and more generally across West Fenton.</p> <p>MW and Clare Tulloch have been looking at work done on Quiet Lanes in Clackmannanshire, and they will also be meeting the Council's Transportation team.</p>	<p>JH</p>
