Ward Priorities

1. Road Safety

- Police received a call in the afternoon of Thursday 27th June regarding a male walking in the middle of the road possibly drunk on the B1377 just before Ballencrieff. Police attended and searched the area however no trace of the male.
- In the evening of Thursday 27th June, a call was received regarding 2 vehicle driving at speed, weaving about the road and appeared to be racing each other on the Longniddry to Drem Road. Local officers made aware.
- Complaint received on 27th June regarding dangerous driving from the Gullane to Haddington Road. Police attended and details taken to try and trace and warn the driver re the manner of his driving.
- In the evening of Monday 1st July, a report was received of cars racing at speed on Goose Green Road, Gullane heading to Gullane Bents. Police unable to attend at time of call. No VRMs known.
- Complaints received regarding the parking in Main Street, Gullane. Local officers are aware and will give passing attention when possible.
- On Monday 15th July, on the High Street, Aberlady, a male was given a conditional offer of a fixed penalty for driving a motor vehicle whilst using a handheld mobile phone.
- On Tuesday 23rd July a collision between a car and an electric scooter took place in Dirleton, the driver of the scooter sustained a broken hip.

2. Antisocial Behaviour

- In the early hours of Saturday 30th June, a noise complaint was received regarding an address in Goose Green Road, Gullane. Details taken and passed onto the East Lothian Council Noise Team.
- On Monday 1st July, call was received regarding youths causing a nuisance in the area of Goose Green Road, Gullane. Police attended however no trace of youths on arrival.
- In the evening of Sunday 7th July, police were informed of cars doing doughnuts at Gullane Bents and motor bikes which had been on the beach. Vehicles concerned had since left and no VRM's were noted.

- On Thursday 4th July, police were informed of a possible unexploded mortar shell on Gullane Beach. Police and EOD attended and confirmed it was a 2 inch mortar shell. Controlled explosion took place.
- Between midnight and 0800 hours on Sunday 7th July, a green Ford Kuga motor vehicle was stolen from a driveway in Muirfield Gardens, Gullane. Police attended and enquiries are ongoing.
