7	<p>Police Report TD reviewed the report and highlighted incidents in the community council area. As discussed at the August GACC meeting (following a discussion of the parking tickets at Gullane Bents) Cllr JG suggested it might be helpful to re-open the old overflow car park at Gullane Bents. Cllrs JG and JH to speak with Tom Reid, Head of Infrastructure at ELC about this possibility. Cllr JG also suggested GACC take a look at the wider parking strategies). Carried forward. There were instances of drug possession reported in Longniddry Bents car park 3 and the Gullane Bents car park with the consequence being recordable police warnings. TD will speak with PC Paterson to enquire if these individuals were drug tested to determine if it was safe for them to drive. JB/TD will also bring this up at the next CAPP meeting. ELC will be applying for planning permission. The ELC Active Travel Group will keep an eye on the electric bike charging points issue. Cllr JH advised that she is working on proposals for the next ELC budget for toilet refurbishment to include the toilet facilities at Gullane Bents. It is possible that funding could come from the NBCAP, and TD will raise this at the next NBCAP meeting. GM is consulting with other Gullane members re: bike stands and will report back. There has been frustration in the village over the temporary traffic lights related to the CALA developments that are left up over the weekends when no work is being done.
