I am aware that there may be more incidents but, due to the nature of these, or ongoing investigations, I cannot give full details.

They are broken down in terms of the agreed priorities for the ward.

Ward Priorities

1. Road Safety

- In the evening of Tuesday 25th August, police were called regarding a tree which had fallen and was blocking the slip road onto the B1345 into Dirleton. East Lothian Council contacted and will deal with.
- In the morning of Friday 28th August, a complaint regarding dangerous driving between Gullane and Aberlady was received. Details taken and enquiries to speak with driver to be made.
- On Sunday 30th August, police received a report of dangerous driving where the complainer was nearly knocked off his bike. Police attended and spoke with complainer however an incorrect VRM was provided and no further scope for obtaining correct VRM.
- In the evening of Saturday 19th September, in Lyars Road, Longniddry, police observed a car making a dangerous manoeuvre within a residential area. Due to this police stopped the vehicle. Checks revealed male driver had no insurance. Driver subsequently cautioned and charged.

2. Antisocial Behaviour

- On Tuesday 8th September, the workshop at Gosford Sawmill has been smashed up by youths. Details taken and further enquiries to be made.

3. Housebreaking

- A male was disturbed whilst trying to break into a garage in The Hawthorns, Gullane at about 2300 hours on Sunday 6th September. Male made off and police were contacted the following morning. Enquiries ongoing to identify male.

4. Parking – August 2020 issued by ELC

- Aberlady - 4 PCN's (3 outside Nature Reserve)
- Gullane - 163 PCN's (156 at Gullane Bents)
- Yellowcraigs - 167 at Yellowcraigs

Other Incidents of note / relevant Community Council information

- In the afternoon of Saturday 29th August, police received a report of persons camping in woodland at Yellowcraig who had lit a fire in an area where there were strictly no fires allowed. Fire Service contacted and attending.
- It was reported on 30th August that sometime overnight persons have broken into a shed in Gullane and stolen a silver mountain bike. Enquiries ongoing.
- On Sunday 13th September, police were called to a male being bitten by a dog. Male taken to hospital as may need stitches. Police have spoken with owner of dog and now liaising with ELC Dog Warden.
- On Friday 18th September, whilst police were on routine patrol in Main Street, Gullane, a male was found in possession of a personal amount of cannabis. Male issued with a Recordable Police Warning.
- In the early hours of Sunday 20th September, police carried out a positive drugs search at Longniddry car park no 3.
